We do that with authenticity, looking for ways to build authentic friendship. We create opportunities for engagement; volleyball on the Pentacrest, free hot chocolate on the corner. We host bonfires and welcome everyone who is walking by. We go in groups to the dining halls and strike up conversations. By example, we are teaching students we already know to do the same.

This way of building authentic friendships has tremendously changed my priesthood at the Newman Center. No longer am I meeting new students just during the first weeks of school. This ministry approach means I am meeting new students all throughout the year. This year I have met students who came from no faith background, or from another Christian denomination, several who came from Hindu background and one who is Jewish to name a few. And the reason I met these people is because our students are now finding joy in sharing their faith as they share their lives with roommates, with classmates, and those they have met at lowa. Once we win them over, we invite them to come to the Newman Center, or they are invited to the library, coffee shop, or a park. The location is not as important as what they are invited to join.

Growth does not happen accidentally most of the time. We are being more intentional than ever in what we do and how we do it. We set goals so that we can meet or exceed them. We celebrate the small victories and continue to look for larger ones. As you look through this newsletter, you will see examples of these victories. I hope you enjoy seeing the fruit of our labor and your stewardship come to life through the students at the Newman Center.

I invite you, as the Church, to invest in the Church that reaches out to those on the campus of The University of Iowa. And you can do that in two primary ways. **Some give by serving. Two Familiar Faces Take on New Roles



With an honest heart, the Newman Center was the last place I wanted to visit as a new university student. I had no physical or emotional draw to becoming a true Catholic. My Godparents implored me to check out the Catholic student center, and my first experience here was just to appease them. I had no intention of being a regular at the Newman Center, but little did I know it would become the most important place in my life.

I was lost and broken, a freshly graduated high school student who had a desire for rebellion and no intention of finding out what I was made for. But what a wonderful mistake I made walking through the doors of Newman. I had no idea at the time, but God stirred up something in me and placed a desire that would be quick to blossom.

I met a missionary right as I was trying to sneak out the doors after Mass. I remember feeling frustrated as I told myself 'Why did you come here, you do not want to get involved here". I was invited for months by people asking me to go to Mass, go on student retreats, and join a Bible study. I was hesitant to join but ended up saying yes to Bible study (still defiant of the student retreats because I was not going to be *that* Catholic). Months passed, and still lukewarm in my faith, I for some reason, decided to say yes to going on the Fall student retreat.

God awakened that desire for Him that He put on my heart as I walked into Newman for the first time. I had never felt such a sense of comfort, community, and love as I did surrounded by those who loved Jesus so deeply. Over the next year, I fell into my faith. I had a desire to do better and to love my Creator deeper. My life radically changed as I found a home away from home.

The Newman Center brought me a family I did not even know I needed.

From the outside, the Newman Center looks unassuming and ordinary, but the people there give the place life and color. I yearn to go to the Newman Center every day and see the faces of the people who pushed me to grow in my faith. If it was not for the persistent missionary I encountered, on what I planned to be my only day in the Newman Center, I would not have learned to love the life I am living. I pray that other people may take a chance at the Newman Center and discover for themselves the people who inhabit this place make it life changing. I will forever be thankful for Newman, and I desire greatly to reach other people and give back my time and love to a place that changed me so deeply.

- **Growing Disciples:** 74 students in a period of small group Catholic mentorship learning how to live and teach the faith, an increase of over 40 from last year!
- Commissioned Disciples: 51 students who have now started leading other students through Bible studies and discipleships of their own. 10 more than last year!

FOCUS has defintely been one of, if not the most life changing organization that I know. Through its missionaries, Bible studies, and discipleship, I was able to find a community at the Newman Center that allowed me to understand my faith in a way that I had never before.
